 1. This course satisfies the DATA 2000 eight hour training requirement.
 2. Certificates will be provided to each physician who completes the training requirement.
 3. Certificates may be mailed to the Secretary of Health and Human Services along with a Request for Waiver of the special registration requirements defined in the Controlled Substances Act.
- One-on-one mentoring via phone, email or site visit is available through the assistance provided via the Physician Clinical Support System (PCSS), www.pcssmentor.org.

Who Should Attend?

This program is recommended for physicians with experience and/or interest in treating patients with opioid dependence. It is also recommended for physicians specializing in primary care, psychiatry, HIV, pain and addiction medicine.
