



The Department of Psychiatry at the Geisel School of Medicine at Dartmouth and Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center announce an unexpected vacancy for the one-year PGY-5 Addiction Psychiatry Fellowship for the academic year 2014-2015. Due to the lateness of this vacancy, the starting date (normally July 1, 2014) can be flexible if needed. The Fellowship offers comprehensive training in all aspects of addiction psychiatry. Geisel Department of Psychiatry Faculty include five psychiatrists with additional ABPN certification in Addiction Psychiatry, as well as nationally known experts in the treatment in dually diagnosed chronically mentally ill patients.

Clinical experience is divided between Dartmouth-Hitchcock Medical Center and the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Hospital in White River Junction, VT, five miles away. Fellows rotate through the full continuum of care, including an inpatient residential program at the VAMC, an intensive outpatient program at DHMC, outpatient addiction psychiatry clinics, Dartmouth undergraduate student health clinics, buprenorphine programs, outpatient pain clinics, inpatient consultation-liaison services, and a methadone maintenance treatment program.

Completion of the fellowship prepares the fellow to sit for the examination for Board Certification in Addiction Psychiatry offered by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology.
