More than 800 physicians, nurse practitioners, PAs, psychologists, social workers and pharmacists attended the Annual Meeting and two preconference courses: The Addictions and Their Treatment Course and Advanced Psychopharmacology Course. For those of you who aren't familiar with our pre-conference courses, The Addictions and Their Treatment course updates the audience on the most recent trends in the addiction field and help psychiatrists prepare for the ABPN examination for subspecialty certification and recertification in Addiction Psychiatry. The Advanced Psychopharmacology Course is an intensive two-day, 12-hour course designed to give attendees a deeper understanding of pharmacologies and is now in its second year! Both courses will be available prior to the 31st Annual Meeting and Scientific Symposium this December.

Attendees had the opportunity to participate in 30 workshops, 10 papers, 73 posters, 1 film workshop, a Medical Update on *Substance Use and Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) for HIV Prevention: Best practices for the Addiction Psychiatrist, a Case Conference on Amphetamine Use Disorder* and to collaborate in various educational activities, committee meetings, regional meetings and fun/ relaxing events.

One of the biggest highlights of the meeting were the five scientific symposia that covered topics on: Treatment for Youth with OUD: New Developments and Approaches, Cannabis Policy and Outcomes for the Addiction Psychiatrist: Making Progress Toward Model State Laws to Reduce Harm, Evaluation and Treatment of Opioid Use Disorder in the Emergency Department: A New Frontier in the Effort to Combat the Opioid Epidemic, Are We
